NSPDK, Incorporated—Who We Are



The **National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa**, Inc. a 501C3 organization of educators was founded in 1923 by eight young teachers in Jersey City, N J. As a professional institution of instructors, the Sorority addresses strong educational issues through numerous programs designed to improve instruction and offer opportunities to scores of young children, youth and adults. NSPDK has sponsored initiatives to assist beginning teachers, support good health habits, promote academic achievement, and preserve African American History.

Membership is open to women holding a degree from accredited colleges or universities who are state certified and actively engaged in the field of education, or women with same qualifications who retired within the last five years. The Sorority seeks to attract individuals who possess good moral character, exemplify respect for themselves and others and exhibit admirable integrity.

The National Program constitutes the activity center of the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc. and is carried out by each of the 115 active chapters in the five regions of the United States. Youth, Education and Service (Y.E.S.) provides activities for high school young ladies, Xinos and gentlemen, Kudos, and college students entering the education field, Kappa Omicron Tau (KOT). Scholarships are provided to two eligible graduating seniors entering the education area of study in each of the five regions. Local Chapters also provide scholarships to qualifying high school seniors entering the area of education. Additionally, all chapters support Sickle Cell Research at Meharry Medical College, in Nashville, TN, Afri-care, and the Florence Steele Hunt Endowment at New Jersey City University, in Jersey City, NJ. Dr. Hunt was one of the organization's founders.

As the founding chapter, Alpha Chapter prides itself in the numerous local projects and activities completed to address the Y.E.S Program. The chapter sponsors the Lily Pearl Nutrition Program in Jersey City that works with the State of New Jersey to feed more the four thousand students in afterschool programs. Additionally, the chapter instituted the Ella Wells Butler Book Scholarship, named for one of our founders. We celebrate this recognition along with two elementary schools in Jersey City named for two of our founders, Gladys Cannon Nunery (School #29) and Julia Abury Barnes (School #12).

Alpha Chapter proudly displays banners indicating who we are and the nutrition program we sponsor in front of its office located at 155 Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard in Jersey City, NJ.


