Soror Mary Ennon National Cochair of the Florence Steele Hunt Education Scholarship at NJCU. and her committee Soror Donna Scott-Motley and Basileus Gwendolyn Jackson met with Ms. Jane McClellan, Executive Director of Alumni Relations and Mr. Richard Rodney, Director, NJCU Fund to inquire about the status of the Florence Steele Hunt Scholarship.

Information provided showed that the scholarship had been established following Founder Hunt's receiving an Honorary Doctorate Degree from the College in 1997.

The committee learned that it was through the efforts of Past Supreme Basileus Della Oliver that a \$10,000 endowment was established. In addition,18 scholarships have been awarded from the interest since 2001. The scholarship is given to students meeting the criteria and entering any area of education, which includes music, Founder Hunt's specialty.
